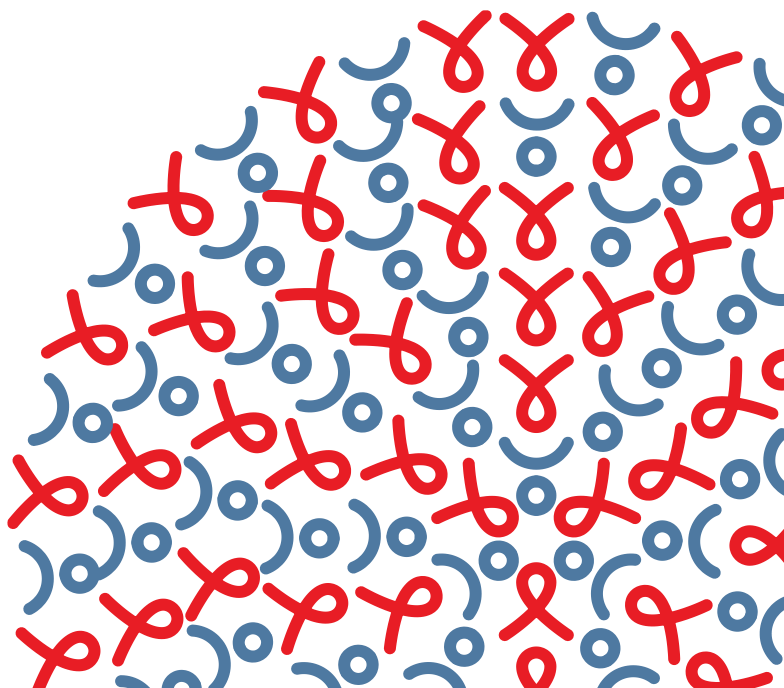
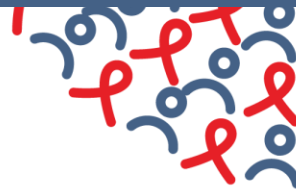


MEETING TARGETS AND MAINTAINING

Call for Expressions of Interest (EOI)

GRANT TO IMPLEMENT COMMUNITY-BASED HIV
PREVENTION, CARE AND TREATMENT ACTIVITIES FOR
KEY POPULATIONS IN TAJIKISTAN

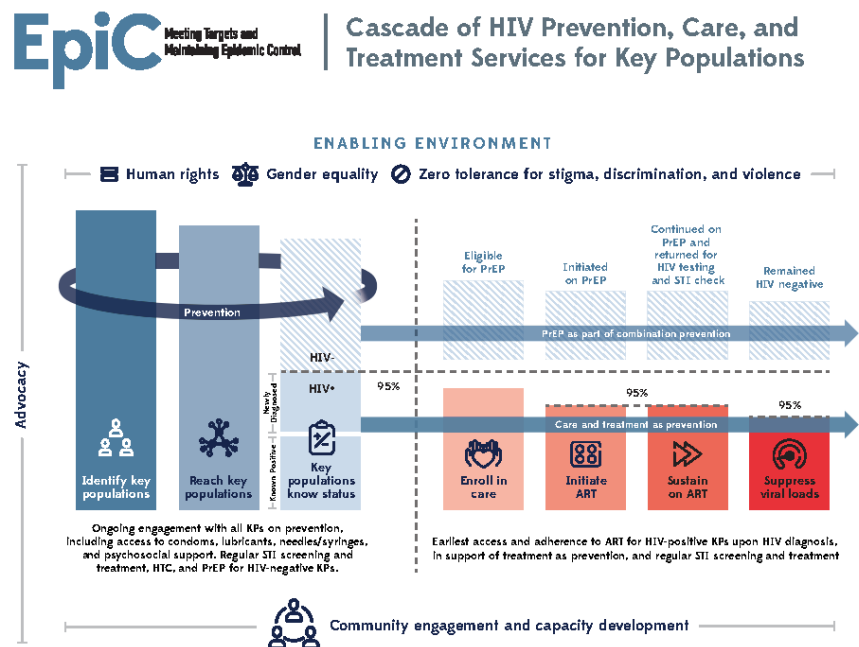

I. Background

Meeting Targets and Maintaining Epidemic Control (EpiC), primed by FHI 360, is a five-year (2019–2024) global project funded by the U.S. President’s Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) that is dedicated to achieving and maintaining HIV epidemic control. The EpiC project in Central Asia will build on the successes of the Central Asia HIV Flagship Project to further address remaining gaps in the cascade of HIV services for key populations (KP).

This announcement is a call for expressions of interest (EOIs) from local Tajik public organizations (PO) and civil society organizations (CSO) and community-based organizations (CBOs) – herein referred to as CSOs – to implement interventions improving access of key populations to quality HIV prevention, care and treatment services for a 124-month period beginning October 1, 2021 until September 30, 2022. Through this competitive process, EpiC intends to select and provide community engagement grants and technical assistance to a Tajik CSO that meets the criteria outlined in this document. In Tajikistan, EpiC implementing activity, utilizing the HIV continuum of prevention, care, and treatment cascade (Figure 1) as the overall strategic framework for program implementation.

II. Scope of Work

The objective of the EpiC program in Tajikistan is to reduce HIV incidence and mitigate the impact of HIV among the most at-risk KP by utilizing a client-centered community-based differentiated service delivery model that provides a comprehensive package of services and interventions for KP, ranging from hotspot-based coverage within geographic locations to virtual online-to-offline approaches. EpiC Tajikistan aims to fill critical gaps, reduce bottlenecks, and eliminate barriers across the HIV prevention, care, treatment, and support cascade (identify, reach with prevention services and commodities, link to HIV, STI and Hepatitis C (HCV) testing and counselling, wrap-around services referrals, peer outreach and navigation activities for improved linkages, retention and adherence to ART) to reach the 95:95:95 goals by 2030 among KP in Tajikistan. EpiC is tasked to build the capacity of local community-based people living with HIV (PLHIV) and/or KP organizations to deliver HIV services tailored to the needs of PLHIV and KP. While significant progress has been made to date, USAID/Tajikistan and EpiC aims to support approaches that are systematic, coordinated, data-driven, and community-led that will significantly stem new infections, mitigate the impact of HIV, and address structural barriers, including stigma and discrimination.

The selected organization will undertake activities among PLHIV and the most at-risk KP to contribute to the program objectives and targets. Illustrative activities are listed in Table 1 by EpiC result area and to address the indicators listed. Interested organizations should identify the activities they will implement in order to successfully reach each of these result areas. During the EOI process, EpiC will help coordinate between CSO Applicants to ensure that all of the key activities are being addressed within the final selection of CSO. Interested CSOs can think creatively about additional activities that use innovative strategies not mentioned in this EOI to address EpiC result areas and indicators.

Geographic Scope*:

- Khudjand City, Sughd Region

*Organizations already working with PLHIV and the most at-risk KP in the highlighted geographic areas will be prioritized in the selection process.

Table 1: Illustrative Key Activities

<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Organization in the Khujand City the Community Health Center to KP and PLHIV with a complex of preventive and counseling services, primary diagnostics / rapid testing, promotion of treatment initiation, support of adherence to treatment and ART home delivery.2. Develop and implement innovative Strategic Behavior Change Communication (SBCC) and Information Communication Technology (ICT) and social media strategies for increasing demand for HIV services among KP.3. Develop and implement innovative peer outreach and navigation models to reach KP and offer services of Community Health Center.4. Introduce and work on demand generation for the services including through close cooperation with local HIV service CBOs to attract KPs and PLHIV to apply for services of Community Health Center.5. Organization of peer counseling and support for KP and PLHIV.6. Provision of HIV rapid testing services (using capillary blood and saliva) and communication with institution for confirmatory testing and initiation of ART in accordance with the license permit of the MoHSPPT RT.7. Introduce and organize a rapid STI testing service, STI counseling and liaison with institution to initiate treatment.8. Introduce and organize express testing services for viral hepatitis C (HCV), advice on HCV treatment and liaison with the institution to initiate treatment (Within existent cooperation with the State Institution “Markazi Hun”).9. Introduction and organization of primary medical diagnostics services through biochemical blood and urine tests, blood pressure, temperature, weight and height indicators etc.10. Introduction of the service of collection and express delivery of blood samples to the territorial AIDS center for confirmatory HIV testing and testing to determine the level of viral load (VL).11. Integration and implementation of pre – exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) services in accordance with the national PrEP protocol/ Introduce and organize delivery of PrEP services for KPs eligible for PrEP (in consideration with RAC).12. In close interaction with HIV services CBOs to cover newly found PLHIV with case management and/or specific services listed in section 13. below13. Integration and implementation of home delivery of ART drugs to patients; monitoring adherence to ART, organizing adherence counseling; assistance in initiating ART treatment; provision of ART drugs as prescribed by specialists of the territorial AIDS center and monitoring of the VL level in accordance with the Order of the MHSPT No. 616 dated August 14, 2020.14. Implementation of systems of services and collecting feedback from customers.15. Facilitate community lead monitoring activities.

EpiC Tajikistan will contribute to the goals and objectives of Tajikistan national HIV program, guided by national guidelines and within the priorities of PEPFAR’s regional operational plan for Tajikistan. Organizations responding to the EOI should propose targets for the following indicators:

- KP_PREV: Number of key populations reached with individual and/or small group-level HIV prevention interventions designed for the target population

- HTS_TST & HTS_TST_POS: Number of KP who received HIV Testing Services (HTS) and received their test results
- PREP_NEW: Number of individuals who have been newly enrolled on (oral) antiretroviral pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) to prevent HIV infection
- PREP_CURR: Number of individuals that received oral PrEP during the reporting period
- TX_NEW_VERIFY: Number of KPLHIV confirmed as newly enrolled on antiretroviral therapy (ART)

III. Anticipated Period of Performance

October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022 (12 months) with possibility of continued funding beyond this period depending on performance and availability of funds.

IV. Funding Availability

EpiC anticipates awarding one grant under this EOI. Applicants should budget based off from their historic operational costs, proposed geographic reach and targets in their applications. Applicants should understand that submitted budgets are illustrative and if awarded a grant, budgets will be revised based off identified final targets and geographic scope.

V. Eligibility Criteria and Selection

To respond to this EOI, an organization must meet all of the following minimum eligibility criteria identified below:

- Must be duly registered in Tajikistan.
- Must be willing to work with all PLHIV and key population groups.
- Documented experience working with KP groups and acceptance for all KPs.
- Must be able to submit a stamped support letter from the local AIDS Center in the geographic area where the CSO operates.
- Must be licensed for rapid HIV testing using capillary blood tests.
- Must be able to comply with all USG regulations as per <https://www.usaid.gov/ads/policy/300/303mab>.
- Able to show evidence of current and past donor-funded HIV and AIDS projects with technical areas of focus (include information on target groups reached and numbers served). Please emphasize any work that you have done related to the most at-risk key populations; HIV/AIDS prevention, care, and treatment activities; human rights; stigma and discrimination; increasing health service access; and gender and gender-based violence.
- Must be forthcoming of any conflict of interest: the Applicant's relationships, associations, activities, and interests should not create a conflict of interest that could prevent full impartiality in implementation of the grant activities.

- Must have or be in the process of obtaining a DUNS number (<https://fedgov.dnb.com/webform>).

Any organization that does not meet these minimum eligibility criteria will not be considered.

Applications will undergo a preliminary review for completeness and responsiveness. Incomplete applications, applications judged to be unresponsive to the EOI, and applications submitted after the due date and time will be considered ineligible and will NOT be considered for an award.

VI. Application Instructions

Applications should be no longer than seven pages, excluding the budget and annexes, and include the following information.

A. Organizational Background (1.5 pages maximum)

Applicants should briefly detail the following information in the organizational background section. This information can be presented in a table format if needed.

1. Name of the organization.
2. Contact person and full address (physical, postal, telephone and email).
3. Type of organization (, CSO, CBO) and registration status. Indicate if it is a membership organization.
4. Current geographical coverage (communities, hot spots, health centers). Please note any current or past presence in the targeted regions.
5. Organizational vision, mission, goal and objectives.
6. A list of current and recently completed HIV projects within the last five years. Please include for each project the technical and geographic areas of focus, the groups served, and numbers reached. Please emphasize any work that you have done related to the most at-risk KP groups and identify the specific KP groups; HIV prevention, care, and treatment activities; human rights; stigma and discrimination; increasing access to health services; gender; and gender-based violence.
7. Sources and funding levels for the past three years. Indicate if the sources are private/foundation or government (United States, Tajikistan, other).
8. Key findings from annual financial audit reports conducted within the past three years, if available (copies of the audited financial reports should be included in the annex).
9. Organizational structure and staffing/membership level.
10. Copy of the license permit of the MoHSPP RT
11. DUNS Number or proof of steps being taken to obtain one.

B. Technical Application (5.5 pages maximum)

Applicants should detail in Attachment A «Project Description» all required information within the key targets of EpiC in the technical application.

Illustrative Budget

Applicants should prepare and submit a proposed budget in accordance with their proposed interventions in Attachment B Budget for the 12-month period of performance (October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022). Applicants must submit the budget in Excel format using the template provided Appendix B and Appendix C Budget Description.

C. Annexes (no page limit)

In the annex, Applicants should submit Copies of Certificate of Registration or Incorporation Papers, a letter of support from the local AIDS Center, license permit and annual audited financial statements for the past three years (if available).

Completed EOIs are due to FHI 360 by **5:00pm TJT on July 28, 2021.** Applications must be submitted by email to fhi360tajikistan@fhi360.org to be considered. Applications should be submitted in Microsoft Word (Appendix A Project Description and Appendix C Budget Narrative) and Excel (for the budget Appendix B) and in English or Russian; applications in other languages will not be accepted. Please do not include attachments over 15 MB.

In the subject line of the email, please indicate "EpiC/Tajikistan EOI – [*name of your organization*]". Only one application may be submitted per organization.

After the EOI review process, FHI 360 may contact Applicants with questions to clarify aspects of their EOIs.

- FHI 360 reserves the right to disqualify any offer based on Applicant's failure to follow EOI instructions;
